

ARHG 107 Human Rights

This course covers human rights historical development, major human rights laws, treaties, and conventions. To learn obligations as citizens and residents of Bahrain as well as a member of the international community and to understand Human Rights Enforcement Mechanisms in Bahrain. (*Pre-requisites: None*)

Course Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of what are Human Rights.
- 2. Explain the history of the declaration of human rights.
- 3. Relate basic human rights to daily life.
- 4. Use basic skills to classify human rights into the three basic divisions.
- 5. Use human rights information to arrive, with some guidance, at conclusions about the mechanisms of human rights implementation in Bahrain.
- 6. Operate in teams to discuss cases related to human rights in different contexts.
