

DSGN 401 Capstone I

This course focuses on the methodological basis of a capstone project focusing on progression of the concept and developing the skills needed to understand and carry out a research-based visualization process.

(Pre-requisites: Completion of 90 credit hours)

Course Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

1. understand and incorporate cultural nuance and historical relevance into their research.
2. understanding of and the ability to incorporate necessary production techniques for their projects into their plan.
3. understand and incorporate ethical considerations while preparing and planning the project.
4. define design problem, research objectives, and to find the appropriate multimedia design idea to draw project conclusions.
5. review, analyse and critique what learnt through the research process and create a viable project outcome.
6. identify likely challenges and risks in the project and include risk mitigation plans within the project proposal.
7. conduct multimedia design research to communicate the project content and outcomes effectively.
8. learn to convey confidence and engage stakeholders, both through independent work and through working with partners as appropriate.
9. understand how a successful Multimedia Design project research has the power to propel a successful career forward in MMD fields.
